





Is there merit in considering how Ramsey might be revitalised over the next five to ten years?

What are your views on the masterplan framework so far?









R1 – Cycle & Digital Connections – Cycle route improvements








R2 – Pedestrian-Friendly Space: 3 new pedestrian crossings





R3 –Great Whyte: a destination – Market/Produce Pop-Ups




R3 – Great Whyte: a destination – Accessibility Hub








R3 – Great Whyte: a destination – Mews Close (3 houses adj. Business Hub





R4 – Fen Links Visitor Economy – 3 new moorings around High Lode






Housing Delivery: Northern Stocking Fen Road – 125 units in waterside development






Which projects HDC should prioritise according to respondents:




What would encourage the respondents to spend more time in the town centre?

Written Feedback: Ramsey Town Council

- R1 Improved cycling infrastructure is a proposal that is widely supported by the Council. Connections linking Ramsey to Yaxley, Holme, and Ramsey St Mary's would be ideal for commuting and leisure, as well as the potential for cyclist tourism.
- R2 A market square would be feasible, and the Council support the idea of having an area to host social events away from traffic. They also suggested improving greenery around the Great Whyte, such as trees in planters.
- R3 A business hub would be ideal for business owners, as well as workers operating from home, but not at the expense of car parking. The Council suggested the redevelopment of the northern end of Ramsey, along Great Whyte, which could attract businesses.

- R4 There is a need to develop an attractive environment for visitors arriving at High Lode by boat, however a hub for watersport leisure activities may be more enticing than additional moorings.
- R5 The Council feel if the building could be redeveloped into luxury apartments, maximising the heritage that Ramsey offers. Other ideas include a school complex, and a new sports facility.
