

Validation Checklist and Guidance – Works to Trees Subject to a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) and Notification of Proposed Works to Trees in Conservation Areas (CA)

## **General Notes**

- The statutory determination period for works subject to a TPO is 8 weeks from the date the application is valid
- Any works apart from felling should be clearly described and state what will remain (in metres) or how much you are looking to remove in metres. Works specifications should not use percentages as part of the proposals.
- Applicants should be aware of the possibility of bats or nesting birds and that there is legislation protecting them.

		<ul> <li>if your reasons relate to the condition of the tree(s) - written evidence</li> </ul>	
		from an appropriate expert	
		<ul> <li>if you are alleging subsidence damage - a report by an appropriate</li> </ul>	
		engineer or surveyor and one from an arboriculturist.	
		in respect of other structural damage - written technical evidence	

Unauthorised work to a tree protected by a TPO or a tree in a conservation area is a criminal offence.
