## Huntingdonshire's Design Guide SPD 2017 – Compatibility Statement (September 2021)

Huntingdonshire's Design Guide Supplementary Planning Document was adopted in 2017 following public consultation and approval by the Council's Cabinet. The Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) supports policies LP 11 Design Context, LP 12 Design Implementation, LP 14 Amenity, LP 16 Sustainable Travel, LP 17 Parking Provision and Vehicle Movement and LP 21 Town Centre Vitality and Viability of Huntingdonshire's Local Plan to 2036.

Paragraph 128 of the <u>National Planning Policy Framework 2021</u> (NPPF) introduced the requirement that in order to achieve well designed places Local Planning Authorities should prepare design guides or codes consistent with the principles set out in the <u>National Design Guide</u> or <u>National Model Design Code</u>. This enables Local Planning Authorities to provide a local framework for creating beautiful and distinctive places. Paragraph 129 goes on to state that Design Guides can be prepared at an area-wide, neighbourhood or site-specific scale, and to carry weight in decision-making, they can be produced either as part of a Local Plan or as supplementary planning documents.

To ensure that the Huntingdonshire's Design Guide SPD 2017 meets the new criteria set out in the NPPF 2021, the council has undertaken a compatibility check of the SPD against the requirements set out in the National Model Design Guide and National Model Design Code's, both of which incorporate 10 characteristics for a well-designed place.

The results are set out below and confirm that Huntingdonshire's Design Guide SPD 2017 meet the requirements of both the National Model Design Guide (NMDG) and the National Model Design Code's (NMDC) 10 characteristics of a well-defined place and go over and above the minimum requirements as set out in the paragraph 35 (page 7) of the NMDG and paragraph 27 (Page 6) of the NMDC. This means Huntingdonshire's Design Guide SPD 2017 can be considered up to date and be used as a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.
